The II Hungarian Sports Meeting for Naturists at Sziksósfürdő

The II Hungarian Sports Meeting for Naturists was held on the Sziksósfürdő grounds from

July 29 to August 5, 1989.

Organizers of that Meeting were the Szeged Napóra Club; the Szeged Bathes & Waterworks Enterprise that owned the grounds; AnnaTours, their travel agency in Szeged; Internacia Naturista Organizo Esperantista

(INOE); the Camping Club of County Csongrad and the East European Documentation Centre on Naturism & Related Subiects (EEDC).

The Meeting was sponsored by many companies, a list of which is given at the end of this article.

The Gathering was declared open at 11:00 on Sunday, July 30, and was attended by sixty or so naturists. After the Hungarian flag, the Szeged town flag and the Napóra Club emblem had been hoisted, a lady from the Szeged Bathes & Waterworks Enterprise delivered a lengthy speech. Translators were Ervin Fenyvesi (Esperanto) and Dr János Lázár (German). Naturists from the following countries attended the gathering: Austria. Bulgaria. Czechoslovakia, German Democratic Republic, Greece, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, USA and Yugoslavia.

At the opening session the local TV group interviewed naturist leaders and videorecorded various games; the videotape was shown

all over Hungary by TV1 on August 3.
A staff reporter of the **Délmagyarország** paper attended the opening session and contributed a very good article. Other papers which mentioned the holding of the Sports Meeting were Magyar Nemzet, Népszava and Népszabadság.

The Hungarian Union of Naturists (MNE) was not officially represented. However, local leaders such as Ilona Mihalyi and Zoltán Lipták from MNE Fejér county group; László Mólnár from Féhervar and Imre Gyarmati from MNE Békés county, attended.

11 Esperanto-speaking naturists were present including INOE president Rudolf Balejik (CS). Sponsoring companies were represented in the person of Támas Zoránoy, director of HOLMA company; Béla Tölgyesi, József Dóra and Román Kiss of the Szeged Bathes & Waterworks Enterprise; András Szucs of AnnaTours; András Lukács of EKOESP; Márta Szabó Rantainé and Zsoltné Onczay of the Csongrád County Committee.

Foreign leaders included Robbert and Mona Broekstra of the INIC (NL); Roeland Laudy, editor of the Dutch naturist review Naturisme, Oscar Mifsud from Malta.

Leif Heilberg (USA) was appointed official photographer of the Gathering.

Various games for children, men and women were held from July 29 to 31 and resumed on August 4. Apart from the track and field events such as high jump, long jump, 100 m run additional ones were included, not held at Délegyháza, such as turul, tug-of-war, sack-race, sand-castles building, filling cups with water, while other contests took place: body painting, turban binding, hula-hoop, chess.

There was a three-day compulsory break on account of unpropitious weather. On the evening of August 1 it was rather chilly and the temperature dropped to 9°C!

In view of that unexpected turn naturists paid visits to the Szeged naturist sauna. For some of the Czechoslovaks it was the first time in their lives to share a common sauna.

A sightseeing tour in the city of Szeged was provided by AnnaTours. Márta Bóka guided visitors to the Roman Catholic Church and the impressive Synagogue completed in 1903. Naturists tasted local palascinta at Debrecen and Hági restaurants in the heart of Szeged.

On August 3 a group of visitors went to Opuszta and Skanzen national parks, while the rest of them enjoyed the photographic display inside the large tent. Photos displayed had been taken by Leif Heilberg (USA) and Jacques Barbier (B). Naturist literature was also available.

On August 4 the weather cleared up and everybody came back to the grounds. The games were resumed. This time volleyball, tug-of-war and swimming were held.

The naturist stand staffed by **Éva** Blaskovits, an ardent member of Napóra Club, offered T-shirts with the emblem of the club, badges, stickers, Napóra no. 1. More than 100 T-shirts were either given away or sold.

A kite with the emblem of Napóra club

was flying during the Meeting. **László Kovács** and his team catered for naturists' needs and prepared delicious Hungarian dishes such as goulash, fish soup and so on.

Ferenc Szabó, a veteran naturist from the Algyd' group, did his best to meet the requirements of visitors. He proved to be a hard worker and faithful follower of the naturist movement.

Tibor Gavlik took care of the transport of benches, tables and other equipment required with his Hungarocamion.

The Hungarian Post sold books, magazines newspapers available in three languages as well as postcards. Mária Andóczi Balog was in charge of the sales department.

The closing ceremony took place at 16:00 on August 5. József Dora of the Szeged Bathes & Waterworks Enterprise thanked participants and visitors of Sziksósfürdő grounds. Dr János Lázár, president of Szeged Napóra Club, delivered the medals and diplomas to winners. Diplomas of participation were also given to the organizers.

The II Hungarian Sports Meeting for Naturists was met with full success. It was


by far better organized than the Délegyháza one and aroused enthusiasm to all participants. Napóra club members decided to hold the III Meeting in the summer of 1990. while EEDC considers the idea of holding the I Naturist Games for naturists from East European countries in 1991; an event that had been originally planned to take place at Monsena, Yugoslavia.

Sziksósfürdő grounds have been kept clean and tidy. The company has added four toilets and has improved the facilities. They consider expanding the grounds by buying

nearby property.

The grounds are within easy reach from Szeged and Subotica (YU) and can accommodate a limited number of holidaymakers. At this moment, Sziksósfürdo is the only legal naturist place in the South of Hungary.
